#### CARLTON WILDLIFE CONSERVATION PROJECT – VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Parish Council aim to make improvements to the Sands pond and its surroundings to help maximise its potential for wildlife bio-diversity. Our plans include: landscaping to create a much safer gradually shelving bank for planting marginal vegetation; creating glades for shade-loving native plants and wildflowers; improving public accessibility and safety.

#### First jobs to be done:

- Trimming back briar growth Lopping overhanging branches Uprooting self-set willow sapling
- Creating 'bug shelters' Making and siting bird, bat boxes & hedgehog boxes Monitoring wildlife

#### When:

- An hour or two on a weekday morning during the winter months from 10.30 am to midday What you will need to bring:
- Sturdy footwear and suitable outdoor clothing
   Gardening gloves
   Loppers and/or secateurs Government guidelines, including social distancing, will be observed throughout
