SANDS VILLAGE POND AND SURROUNDING AREA

Work on the village pond and Sands area has been completed for this year and we await our Spring arrivals in 2023! The surface of the pond has been exposed to more light by further removal of willow and extra foxgloves, reedmace and reeds have been planted.

A "wildlife corner" has been established as a mini conservation area and, for safety reasons, the footpath on the southern edge of the pond has been widened.



Robins and bluetits continue to use our nest boxes which have recently been inspected and cleaned ready for next year. Consideration is being given to installing an owl box for 2023!

Next Spring/Summer we hope to hold pond dipping sessions for anyone who may be interested.
