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THIS IS WHAT YOUR PARISH COUNCIL HAVE BEEN WORKING ON AS A PRELUDE TO THE CELEBRATIONS OF THIS MOMENTOUS YEAR IN THE LIFE OF THE NATION.

Platinum Jubilee—Queen's Green Canopy Project

As part of the Queen's Green Canopy Project, the Parish Council were successful in obtaining a number of trees from Lincolnshire County Council Treescape Scheme. The trees will provide part of a national effort to plant specimens, avenues, copses and whole woodlands to recognise and honour the queen's remarkable legacy, which she has built during her reign.

By kind permission of the Lincolnshire Agricultural Society, 2 field corner plots, one off Back Lane, behind the Sands and another near the junction of Bridle Lane with Brigg Lane, in roadside verges along Broughton Road, and in the Playing Field, have been planted by members of the council with the support of volunteers.

The trees chosen comprise mixed indigenous species, including Oak, Beech, Common Alder, Field Maple, Hawthorn, Rowan, Silver Birch, Small Leaved Lime, Sweet Chestnut, Wild Cherry, Hornbeam, Walnut and Crab Apple. This will leave its own green legacy in years to come, bringing benefits for people, wildlife and the climate.

We have informally called the Back Lane planting, 'The Queens Copse' (Photo 1) and that off Bridle Lane, 'The Dukes Plantation' (Photo 2), in memory of His Royal Highness, the Duke of Edinburgh. We hope that the scheme will continue into the future and this years efforts added to.

During the early years of growth, the trees will need a little support and we hope that residents will assist us in helping keep the weeds at bay and giving them a drink. Meanwhile, if anyone feels that they would like to donate a tree of their own, which must be native, please contact the Parish Council for details.

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Queen's Platinum Jubilee

At a meeting of residents held at the village hall on 26th February 2022, those attending agreed on the following proposed calendar of events:

Thursday 2nd June

Lighting of the beacon at Sands Lane will take place at 9.15pm. Residents are requested to gather from 8.30pm.

Sunday 5th June

Children's sports/activities session at the playing field from 12 noon 'Open tea party' on Sunday from 2.30pm, taking place between the Village Hall and the White Hart. Residents to bring their own food, drinks, tables and chairs etc.

The White Hart will make complimentary seating available and there will be an option to purchase food and drink. The residents would like to express their thanks to The White Hart for their support. In the event of inclement weather, the party may be held in the Village Hall (max of 100 persons).

NOTE: Church Street will be closed – except to residents – from 10am until 5pm on Sunday 5th June.

This will be an event organised by residents—not the Parish Council. No point of contact was given for the arrangements at the time of printing.

NORTON DISNEY 'BIG COMMUNITY DIG' PROJECT Norton Disney History and Archaeology Group has contacted the Parish Council seeking a financial donation for a two week community excavation being planned for September 2022. This will involve community members spending time in trenches excavating the archaeology close to the site of Norton Disney's Roman Villa. 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The Pond and Sands area



The work on the village pond has continued over the past 12 months and, with the arrival of Spring migrants, any further work will be reduced to a minimum with a view to keeping the area "tidy". A large amount of invading willow has been removed, water courses cleared, plants generously donated by village residents - including forget-me-not, celandine, flag iris, comfrey and foxglove have been planted, wild flowers sown and further division of snowdrops has been accomplished following last years successful division which resulted in a good show of blooms along Back Lane in Spring.

Two new paths-see 'photos- have been created to provide (a) an alternative view of the pond and (b) access to a woven bird screen. Both paths are wheelchair/pushchair friendly.
