Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on Wednesday 11th May 2022 in Carlton Le Moorland Village Hall

The Chairman of the Parish Council, Cllr. Jeremy Hutchinson welcomed the parishioners to the Annual Parish Meeting.

1a. Present at the Meeting

1b. Apologies for absence

There were apologies from Cllr. E. Surphlis and County Councillor Marianne Overton.

2. Minutes of the Last Annual Parish Meeting – 14th April 2021 and Matters Arising

The clerk had circulated copies of the notes of the last meeting to councillors and on the website prior to the meeting. The minutes were agreed as a true record and signed accordingly.

3. Review of the Year by Chairman of the Parish Council – Cllr. Jeremy Hutchinson

The Chairman noted that Covid-19 continued to play a part in the work of the Parish Council during the early part 2021-22.

The Council was mainly focussed on dealing with final allocation of Lottery funding with plans for an outdoor store, extended patio area and fencing being approved. This work was now nearing completion.

The Council had funded 2 new benches for the Platinum Jubilee and these will be located in front of the Church and on the Sands.

The Parish Council applied to Lincolnshire County Council for over 200 trees as part of the Queens canopy cover scheme and these have been planted on the playing field, Broughton Road , and land on Brigg Lane and Back Lane in collaboration with the Lincolnshire Agricultural Society.

Repairs to the Church clock had been funded by the Parish Council.

There had been significant maintenance at the Sands and elsewhere during the year, and thanks were extended to all the volunteers involved.

Cllr. Hutchinson thanked the Councillors and clerk for all their support during the year, also John Shaw (Internal Auditor), Margaret Harwood (Litterpicking), Margaret Hutchinson (Village Hall bookings) and Sue North (Village Hall).

4. Items, issues and suggestions raised by parishioners

The Council was thanked for all their work on behalf of the village during this last year.

There being no further questions, Cllr. Hutchinson thanked the parishioners for attending and declared the meeting closed at 7.57pm.
