The end of 2024 is rapidly approaching and work at "The Sands" is presently concerned with preparations for Spring 2025!

During the past months further willow has been removed from the pond and a new reed observation screen has been installed.


Bullrushes planted two years ago flowered for the first time this year and are successfully colonizing the South East corner of the pond. The newly planted hedging along Back Lane is progressing well and further clearing of ditches/cutting back of bramble will hopefully ensure a magnificent display of snowdrops in the Spring.

The Sands wildlife area is rapidly becoming a valuable community asset. A recent independent survey remarked upon the significant increase in biodiversity at the site. Long may this continue and, please do remember, this is your area to enjoy.

#### **SPEED INDICATION DEVICE**

The Parish Council has deployed the Speed Indication Device at all village approved locations and is now well into a second phase.

We are delighted to report that the vast majority of drivers obey the speed limits, often keeping well below the 30-mph maximum, showing that they not only follow the speed limit but drive in accordance with the conditions being encountered. Unfortunately, a small minority of drivers disregard the speed limit altogether, posing a danger to other road users. The Parish Council believes these drivers are residents or live close by.

We urge everyone to obey the speed limit and to drive in accordance with the conditions.

We are pleased to report that the extra solar panels



we have installed, the improved controls for overhead heaters and the storage battery have all helped to dramatically cut the energy costs at our village hall, whilst keeping it nice and warm.

The Hall offers lots of activities and events, and when we checked usage we discovered that hall use (footfall) has nearly doubled, from 6,000 in 2016 to 11,000 in this year.
